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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

The Everlasting Gospel of Revelation 14

The Seventh-day Adventist Church bears the responsibility to proclaim the everlasting gospel of Revelation 14 to the world before Jesus' Second Coming. Have we witnessed the fulfillment of this mighty proclamation today? Has it been given to all the nations of the earth? The answer is "not yet", nevertheless, we are to accomplish this task "not by might, nor by power" but by the Spirit of our LORD God.

Preach with Love

"The object of all ministries is to keep self out of sight, and to let Christ appear. The exaltation of Christ is the great truth that all who labor in word and doctrine are to reveal." God is love and the everlasting gospel is about God' love for us. The proclamation is about His love for sinner, a call to true worship by honoring Him as the Creator of the universe and preparation for His soon coming by experiencing transformation in His power. If we share God's love, uplift Him in all the things that we do and not looking to our own interests but the interests of the others (cf. Phil. 2:4), people will know that we truly care for them and will respond favorably to the message we share.

Preach with Patience

The cross of Calvary is a standing pledge of the boundless love and measureless mercy of the heavenly Father to sinners. God has been patient (cf. 1 Cor. 13:4 "love is patient") with His people, especially the Israelites, The numerous calls of the prophets in the Old Testament era to bid them to forsake idolatry and repent from their unfaithfulness demonstrate that God will not easily give up on His people. Today, we must labor in like manner, work with patience, preach with empathy, and believe that God Himself who has begun a good work in the lives of the believers will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ (Phil. 1:6). Never give up sharing the good news, just preach and move forward patiently.

Preach with the Power of the Holy Spirit

When Christ was about to depart to His home in the heavenly courts, He promised that He would be present with them by the Holy Spirit (John 14:16-17). Christ also gave His disciples a promise that after His ascension He would be with them until the end of the world as they proclaim the good news (Matt. 28:19-20). The believers of Christ must, therefore, preach the message with the power of His Holy Spirit. God will work in and through everyone who receives Christ. "Those who know the indwelling of the Spirit reveal the fruits of the Spirit." This is not our work, we partner with God and work according to His guidance and plan.

"We are doubtless near that auspicious hour when the harvest of the earth will be reaped, as described in Revelation 14:14-16." Jesus enlightened the disciples by explaining to them, "Do you not say, 'Four months more, then comes the harvest'? But I tell you, look around you, and see how the fields are ripe for harvesting." (John 4:35, NRSV) We should just trust and obey God. If we are faithful and obedient, God will bless our effort with great success of harvest. May all glory be to God.

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Berita Baik yang Kekal Wahyu 14

Gereja Seventh-day Adventist memikul tanggungjawab untuk memberitakan injil kekal Wahyu 14 kepada dunia sebelum Kedatangan Kedua Yesus. Pada masa ini, adakah kita telah menyaksikan penggenapan pemberitaan yang agung ini? Adakah injil telah diberikan kepada semua bangsa di bumi? Jawapannya adalah "belum", walau bagaimanapun, kita harus menyelesaikan tugas ini "bukan dengan kekuatan tentera ataupun kekuatanmu sendiri" tetapi dengan kuasa Roh Tuhan.

Berdakwahlah dengan Kasih

"Tujuan semua pelayanan adalah untuk diri berselindung, dan membiarkan Kristus muncul. Pengagungan Kristus adalah kebenaran besar yang harus didedahkan oleh semua orang yang raiin berkhutbah dan mengaiar."1 Tuhan adalah kasih dan injil yang kekal adalah tentang kasih Tuhan untuk kita. Pemberitaan itu adalah tentang kasih-Nya terhadap orang berdosa, panggilan untuk penyembahan yang dengan menghormati-Nya benar sebagai Pencipta alam semesta dan persiapan untuk kedatangan-Nya yang tidak lama lagi dengan mengalami perubahan dalam kuasa-Nya. Jika kita berkongsi kasih Tuhan, mengutamakan-Nva dalam semua perkara vang kita lakukan dan memikirkan kepentingan orang lain, bukan hanya kepentingan diri sendiri (rujuk Filipi 2:4), orang akan tahu bahawa kita benar-benar mengambil berat tentang mereka dan akan membalas secara positif kepada mesej yang kita kongsikan.

Berdakwahlah dengan Sabar

Salib Kalvari ialah ikrar tetap kasih yang tidak terbatas dan belas kasihan Bapa di syurga yang tidak terukur terhadap orang berdosa. Tuhan telah bersabar (rujuk 1 Kor. 13:4 "kasih adalah sabar") dengan umat-Nya, khususnya orang Israel. Panggilan berulang kali para nabi dalam era Perjanjian Lama untuk meminta mereka meninggalkan penvembahan berhala dan bertaubat daripada ketidaksetiaan mereka menunjukkan bahawa Tuhan tidak akan mudah menyerahkan umat-Nya. Hari ini, kita mesti bekerja dengan cara yang sama, bekerja dengan kesabaran, berkhutbah dengan empati. dan percava bahawa Tuhan Sendiri vang telah memulakan pekerjaan yang baik dalam kehidupan orang yang percaya akan meneruskannya sehingga selesai pada hari Yesus Kristus (rujuk Filipi 1: 6). Jangan sekali-kali berputus asa dalam berkongsi berita baik, hanya berdakwah dan maju ke hadapan dengan kesabaran.

Berdakwahlah dengan Kuasa Roh Kudus

Apabila Kristus hendak berangkat ke rumah-Nya di halaman syurga, Dia berianii bahawa Dia akan bersama mereka melalui Roh Kudus (ruiuk Yohanes 14:16-17). Kristus juga berianii denaan murid-murid-Nva bahawa selepas kenaikan-Nya, Dia akan menyertai mereka sehingga akhir zaman ketika mereka memberitakan khabar baik (Mat. 28:19-20). Oleh itu, orang-orang yang percaya kepada Kristus mesti memberitakan khabar ini dengan kuasa Roh Kudus-Nya. Tuhan akan bekerja di dalam dan melalui setiap orang yang menerima Kristus. "Mereka yang didiami oleh Roh Tuhan akan memperlihatkan buah Roh."² Ini bukan kerja kita, kita bekerjasama dengan Tuhan dan bekerja mengikut petunjuk dan rancanganNya.

"Tidak diragukan lagi kita sudah hampir dengan waktu apabila tuaian bumi akan dituai, seperti yang diterangkan dalam Wahyu 14:14-16."3 Yesus menerangi para murid dengan menjelaskan kepada mereka, "Kamu berkata, 'Masih empat bulan lagi sebelum musim menuai.' Tetapi Aku berkata kepada kamu, pandanglah ladang yang sudah menguning, siap untuk dituai!" (Yohanes 4:35) Kita hanya perlu percaya dan taat kepada Tuhan. Jika kita setia dan taat, Tuhan akan memberkati usaha kita dengan kejayaan tuaian yang besar. Semoga segala kemuliaan diberikan kepada Tuhan. Saya akan pergi dan memberitakan Injil yang kekal, adakah anda akan bersertaku?



> கிறிஸ்து பரலோக வீட்டிற்குப் புறப்படும்போது, பரிசுத்த ஆவியானவரால் தங்கியிருந்து அவர்களுடன் பிரசன்னமாக இருப்பதாக அவர் வாக்குறுதி அளித்தார் (யோவான் 14:16-17). உலகம் முடியும் வரை, கிறிஸ்து பரம் ஏறினப் பிறகும், சீஷர்களுடன் இருப்பார் என்ற வாக்குறுதியை கிறிஸ்து அவர்களுக்குக் கொடுத்தார். (மத். 28:19-20). ஆகவே, கிறிஸ்துவின் விசுவாசிகள் அவருடைய பரிசுத்த ஆவியின் வல்லமையுடன் நற்செய்தியைப் பிரசங்கிக்க வேண்டும். கிறிஸ்துவைப் பெறுகிற ஒவ்வொருவரிலும் தேவன் செயல்படுவார். 用爱传道

"所有传道事工的目标都是要保持 自我消失不见,而让基督显现。高 举基督乃是凡劳苦传道教导人的人 都要显明的伟大真理。"1 上帝就是 爱,永恒的福音是关于上帝对我们 的爱。这个宣告是关于祂对罪人的 爱,呼吁借着尊崇上帝为宇宙的创 造主而进行真正的敬拜,并通过经 历祂能力的转变为基督复临做好准 备。如果我们分享上帝的爱,在我 们所做的一切事上都高举上帝,不 考虑自己的利益,而是考虑他人的 利益(参见腓立比书 2:4),人们就 会知道我们是真正地关心他们,并 会做出相对的回应。

耐心传道

加略山的十字架是天父对罪人无限 的爱和怜悯的永久保证。上帝对祂 的子民,特别是以色列人一直是很 有耐心(参见哥林多前书 13:4"爱是 恒久忍耐")。旧约时代的先知们曾 经多次的呼吁他们放弃敬拜偶像并 悔改,这就表明上帝不会轻易放弃 祂的子民。今天,我们必须以同样 的方式工作,耐心地工作,带着同 理心传道,并相信上帝会亲自完成到 耶稣基督的日子(参腓1:6)。永远 不要放弃分享福音,只管耐心的传 道并向前进。

靠着圣灵的能力传道

Not Just Learning and Searching the Bible



The Proclamation of the Everlasting Gospel of Revelation 14.

Adventists have been set in the world as watchmen and light bearers of the everlasting Gospel of Revelation 14—to warn and to prepare people for Christ's second coming! (White, 1909). Let's learn about the biblical meaning of "proclamation", and the practical missional endeavours in proclaiming the Three Angels' Messages to the whole world.

Proclamation in the New Testament

Empoweringly, in the Greek New Testament, the word commonly used for "proclamation" is κήρυγμα (kérugma). The term κήρυγμα (kérugma) refers to the act of publicly announcing or proclaiming a message or proclamation with authority. It is often associated with preaching or heralding an important message. The word κήρυγμα (kérugma) is derived from the verb κηρύσσω (kērússō), which means "to proclaim" or "to preach." This verb is frequently used in the New Testament to describe the act of proclaiming or announcing the Gospel or other important teachings. (Papaioannou, 2021)

In the Bible, the concept of proclamation is closely linked to the spreading of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Gospel message, and the Kingdom of God. It involves proclaiming the truth, calling people to repentance, and inviting them to respond in faith. One notable passage where the term κήρυγμα (kérugma) is used is in 1 Corinthians 1:21 (NIV), which states, "For since

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in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not know him, God was pleased through the foolishness of what was preached to save those who believe." Here, the word "preached" is a translation of κήρυγμα (kérugma), emphasizing the proclamation of the message of salvation. Overall, in the Greek New Testament, proclamation (κήρυγμα, kérugma) signifies the act of publicly proclaiming or heralding a message, particularly in the context of sharing the Gospel and calling people to respond in faith. (Pollard, 1994).

Proclamation In the Old Testament

Interestingly, the word and concept of "proclamation" are also found in the Old Testament. In the Hebrew language of the Old Testament, the word most commonly used for "proclamation" is אָרָק (qara). This term carries the idea of calling out, proclaiming, or summoning with a loud voice. The Hebrew word אָרָק (qara) is used in various contexts throughout the Old Testament to describe the act of making a public announcement, declaring a message, or calling people to gather and listen. It can refer to both divine proclamation and human proclamation. The following are a few examples of the use of אָרָק (qara) in the Old Testament:

Proclamation of God's Word

The prophets in the Old Testament were called by God to proclaim His message to the people. For example, in Jeremiah 1:7 (NIV), God says to Jeremiah, "But the Lord said to me, 'Do not say, "I am too young." You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you." The word "say" here is a translation of אָרָק (qara), indicating the divine call to proclaim God's message.

Proclamation of God's Deeds and Attributes

The Old Testament often includes declarations of God's mighty acts, His character, and His glory. For instance, Psalm 96:3 (NIV) says, "Declare his glory among the nations, his marvellous deeds among all peoples." The term "declare" comes from אָרָק (qara), expressing the call to proclaim and make known God's wondrous works.

· Proclamation of Feasts and Assemblies

In the Old Testament, אָרָק (qara) is also used to describe the calling or summoning of people for religious feasts, gatherings, or assemblies. For example, in Leviticus 23:4 (NIV), God instructs Moses, "These are the Lord's appointed festivals, the sacred assemblies you are to proclaim at their appointed times." Here, "proclaim" translates אָרָק (qara), referring to the public announcement of the holy convocations. (Strong Hebrew Dictionary (KJV), 2023).

With the above information, the Hebrew word אָרָק (qara) is used to convey the act of publicly declaring, summoning, or calling out a message or gathering. It encompasses the proclamation of God's Word, His deeds, His character, and the announcement of religious events or assemblies. (Williams, 2016). Missiologically, the Three Angels' Messages of Revelation 14 are a central part of the beliefs and mission of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Revelation 14 in the Bible is a call to worship God, proclaim the everlasting gospel, and prepare people for the second coming of Jesus Christ (Rodriguez, 2021).

Practically, here is a general outline of how the Three Angels' Messages are proclaimed by the Seventh-day Adventist Church (there can be more):

1. Study the Bible and Understand the Messages

The first step is to study and comprehend the Three Angels' Messages as described in Revelation 14:6-12. This involves delving into the biblical text, researching Adventist interpretations, and familiarizing oneself with the church's teachings.

2. Personal Commitment

Proclaiming the Three Angels' Messages starts with personal dedication and living out the principles they convey. It is essential to have a personal relationship with God, a deep understanding of the gospel, and a transformed life reflecting the teachings of Jesus Christ.

3. Share the Message with Others

The next step is to actively share the messages with others. This can be done through personal conversations, Bible studies, public evangelistic campaigns, literature distribution, online platforms, and any other means that allow for communication and interaction. The emphasis is on presenting the truths of the Three Angels' Messages with love, respect, and sensitivity to the needs of the individuals being reached.

Within the context of worship services, evangelistic meetings, or other gatherings, pastors and church leaders often deliver sermons and presentations specifically focused on the Three Angels' Messages. These messages provide an opportunity to explain the significance and relevance of these biblical teachings to the present-day world.

5. Media and Publications

As a church, we utilize various media platforms, including television, radio, websites, social media, and printed materials, to proclaim the Three Angels' Messages. Through these channels, the church disseminates sermons, articles, videos, documentaries, and other resources that explain and promote the messages to a wider audience.

6. Health, Community Services, and Humanitarian Work

The church recognizes that the Three Angels' Messages include a call to holistic health and caring for the needs of others. As such, many Adventists engage in health-related ministries, community service initiatives, and humanitarian projects, which serve as practical expressions of the messages' principles and values.

7. Lifestyle and Community Engagement

Proclaiming the Three Angels' Messages is not limited to verbal communication. We strive to embody the messages in our

daily lives, demonstrating the principles of worshiping God, following the gospel, and preparing for Christ's return through our lifestyle choices, ethical behaviour, and active involvement in their communities.

8. Evangelistic Campaigns

The church often organizes focused evangelistic campaigns to reach out to larger audiences. These campaigns may involve a series of meetings, seminars, or conferences centred around the Three Angels' Messages. They aim to provide in-depth teaching, answer questions, and invite individuals to make decisions for Christ.

9. Missionary Work

Seventh-day Adventists engage in missionary work around the world, spreading the Three Angels' Messages to different cultures and communities. Missionaries may live and work in foreign countries, establishing churches, schools, healthcare facilities, and other ministries that promote the messages' teachings while meeting the practical needs of the people.

10. Sabbath Observance

Our church places a strong emphasis on Sabbath observance, as outlined in the fourth commandment of the Ten Commandments. By faithfully observing the seventh-day Sabbath, we aim to reflect the worship aspect of the Three Angels' Messages and present it as a sign of allegiance to God.

11. Educational Institutions

The church operates a vast network of educational institutions, including schools, colleges, and universities. They provide quality education and also emphasize the integration of faith and learning. Adventist educational institutions often teach the principles of the Three Angels' Messages as part of the curriculum, aiming to prepare students for a life of service and mission.

12. Digital Media and Technology

The church recognizes the power of digital media and technology in reaching a global audience. Through websites, mobile applications, podcasts, livestreaming, and social media platforms, the church disseminates resources, sermons, Bible studies, and interactive content that promote the Three Angels' Messages to individuals around the world.

The church often collaborates with other organizations and entities that share similar goals and values. By partnering with like-minded groups, the church can extend the reach of the Three Angels' Messages and engage in joint efforts to address social issues, promote religious freedom, and contribute to the well-being of society.

Every member is encouraged to share their personal witness and testimonies of how the Three Angels' Messages have impacted their lives. By openly sharing experiences of spiritual growth, answered prayers, and the transformation of character, individuals can effectively communicate the relevance and power of the messages to others.

15. Small Group Ministry

The data collected by General Conference showed that small group ministry is one of the best ways for mission, discipleship, and leadership development that encourages church planting. And within small groups, the Three Angels' Messages may be shared effectively.

16. Mission to the Cities

We are called to preach the Three Angels Messages to all the cities in the world! (Sanchez, 2022).

It's important to note that these steps are general guidelines and can vary in implementation depending on individual and cultural contexts within the Seventh-day Adventist Church and the people that we are proclaiming these messages.

It's important also to remember that proclaiming the Three Angels' Messages is not limited to specific methods or strategies. The church needs more creative ministries to lovingly share the gospel cross-culturally. (Wilson, 2021).

The overarching goal is to communicate the everlasting gospel in a way that resonates with people's hearts, minds, and individual circumstances, ultimately leading them to a personal relationship with God and preparing them for the second coming of Jesus Christ, by the power of the Holy Spirit. Why wait? Let's go!


The Everlasting Gospel of Revelation 14:

For a hundred and twenty years as the countdown to the flood began, the antediluvian world remained oblivious, unmotivated, unconvinced by the proclamation of Noah. No doubt Noah, called the "herald (an official entrusted with making public proclamations) of righteousness"¹, was incessantly ridiculed ² and criticized for being an alarmist. "Why," some too may ask today, "do we keep talking about the Three Angels' Messages?" Well beloved, it's because that's part of our Seventh-day Adventist's DNA. It's akin to asking the late Steve Jobs, "Why do you keep talking about Apple?"

Dr. Merlin Burt encapsulates the whole message, our identity and our mission in one brief, simple but power-packed paragraph: "The Three Angels' Messages are an end-time gospel proclamation that begins with a world-wide preaching of the "everlasting gospel" and ends with the "faith of Jesus." This proclamation features two key doctrines: (1) The Sabbath, as the expression of loyalty to Jesus as our Creator and Redeemer, and (2) the most holy place heavenly sanctuary ministry of Jesus to finish the work of salvation in preparation for the Second Coming."³

Our General Conference president, Dr. Ted Wilson, says it this way: "The first angel's message brings the 'everlasting gospel' to the entire world—a call to worship God as Creator and an announcement of the hour of His judgment. The second builds upon the first, proclaiming that Babylon—a false system of worship that rejects the proclamation of the first angel, accepts the delusions of Satan, and unites with the world—is fallen. The third angel's message brings to light the mark of the beast in contrast to God's true Sabbath as the seal of God, urging people not to receive the mark."⁴



We know the messages are to go out the world over, with urgency. They are not messages to keep secret, but to share, to proclaim! How are we to do that? Here are some pointers:

1. BELIEVE AND UNDERSTAND THE MESSAGES PERSONALLY

We have to personally believe the messages. Do we believe them to be true? Do we have any doubts? If we have, we won't be motivated to share them. If we are unsure or uncertain of the messages, let's seriously study to understand them immediately. Don't just study the three angels' messages. Expand your study to understand the context, background, their end-time implications and applications, encompassing both the books of Revelation and Daniel. Dr. Ted Wilson reminded the world membership that "head knowledge is not enough; these messages must penetrate the heart."⁵

2. ALLOW THE MESSAGES TO TRANSFORM OUR LIVES

"God gave us the Bible to transform us, not simply to inform us," Rick Warren once wrote. "So, all of us who have had that veil removed can see and reflect the glory of the Lord. And the Lord—who is the Spirit—makes us more and more like him as we are changed into his glorious image." ⁶ When the everlasting gospel of Revelation 14 does its work in us individually, people will see that the gospel indeed "is the power of God for salvation." ⁷ A changed life would positively, powerfully and convincingly testify in favour of the three angels' messages. So, let God's Word bring about genuine transformation in our own lives.

3. GET OUR NAME RIGHT

Our name is an integral part of our identity. Beloved, let's get our name right. This is how our name is spelt: Seventhday Adventist. Not Seventh Day Adventist or other variations. There is a distinction! Our name, as a silent witness, testifies to the three angels' messages.

Ellen White wrote, "The name 'Seventh-day Adventist' carries the true features of our faith in front and will convict the inquiring mind. Like an arrow from the Lord's quiver, it will wound the transgressors of God's law, and will lead to repentance toward God, and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ." ⁸

She further implored: "We are Seventh-day Adventists. Are we ashamed of our name? We answer, No, no! We are not. It is the name the Lord has given us. It points out the truth that is to be the test of the churches." ⁹

She repeated this a year later when she wrote: "We are Seventh-day Adventists, and of this name we are never to be ashamed. As a people we must take a firm stand for truth and righteousness. Thus we shall glorify God." ¹⁰

4. DEPEND ON THE HOLY SPIRIT AND USE GOD'S METHODS ALONE

In our quest for church growth, we tend to adopt anything that gives any semblance of "results" or "success." We may copy various methods from popular churches. If we find something to be successful, we all rush into doing the same thing. This is not a criticism. We take this course of action perhaps because we are generally out of ideas that work. But take courage! Don't be disheartened by failings. Use biblically consistent methods and practices befitting our name, values and beliefs. "Christ's method alone will give true success in reaching the people. The Saviour mingled with men as one who desired their good. He showed His sympathy for them, ministered to their needs, and won their confidence. Then He bade them, 'Follow Me.'" ¹¹

5. FAITHFULLY STAY ON MESSAGE

Events on earth vindicates what we've been proclaiming for 160 years. God's Spirit is at work. Stay true to our message. Don't mix it up, dilute, or repress it. God's truth will triumph!

"Heretofore those who presented the truths of the third ange's message have often been regarded as mere alarmists. Their predictions that religious intolerance would gain control in the United States, that church and state would unite to persecute those who keep the commandments of God, have been pronounced groundless and absurd... But as the question of enforcing Sunday observance is widely agitated, the event so long doubted and disbelieved is seen to be approaching, and the third message will produce an effect which it could not have had before." ¹²

Conclusion

Beloved, God's work WILL move forward in PEM because He is in control. We are invited to join His mission. If we are ever unclear of our purpose and mission as a Church, this is it: "In a special sense Seventh-day Adventists have been set in the world as watchmen and light bearers. To them has been entrusted the last warning for a perishing world. On them is shining wonderful light from the word of God. They have been given a work of the most solemn import—the proclamation of the first, second, and third angels' messages. . . . The world is to be warned, and God's people are to be true to the trust committed to them." ¹³

Beloved, can God count on you to join in the proclamation of His messages so that your neighbor may hear the invitation to eternal life?

HEALTH TIPS

Daniel, is a 19 year old male, a highachieving student, with a supportive family and a bright future ahead. However, during his late teenage years, he became captivated by the world of online gaming. As his gaming hours increased, so did his disconnection from reality. Daniel's life began to revolve around his virtual pursuits; with academics, family dynamics, peer relationships, and self-care falling by the wayside. Daniel's grades plummeted as he neglected his studies, staying up late to play games and sleeping through classes. His once-strong relationships with friends and family started to deteriorate. He lost interest in socializing, turning down invitations to spend time with friends in favor of online gaming sessions. His family, particularly his parents, increasingly helpless felt and devastated as they watched their once-ambitious son succumb to the grip of internet overdependence. His lack of self-care became evident, as he ignored personal hygiene and allowed his physical health to decline. Moreover, Daniel showed no initiative to seek employment, leaving him with no direction or purpose outside of his virtual world. The once-promising future he had seemed to slip away, swallowed by the abyss of gaming addiction.

This phenomenon is not unique to Daniel's story but has become increasingly prevalent across the globe. "Otaku" is a Japanese term that originally referred to people with an intense interest in manga, anime, or other similar hobbies, often to the point of social isolation. Over time, the term has broadened to describe people who are excessively dependent on digital platforms, such as the internet and gaming as well.

New words have also emerged in the Japanese language to describe the extreme behaviors associated with internet overdependence. For example, one term refers to a person so glued to the couch that they become almost inseparable, while another term, translating to "bottleman," describes those who are so unwilling to move that they opt to urinate in bottles instead of using the restroom. During the winter, these individuals may even use the bottles as makeshift warmers after passing urine. These stories and linguistic inventions highlight the severity of the issue and illustrate how deeply the lives of young people can be affected by internet overdependence today.

In today's digital era, the internet offers countless opportunities for learning, entertainment, and connection, but it also presents potential risks to young people's mental health and well-being. Internet overdependence. characterized by excessive and compulsive use of the internet, can significantly interfere with an individual's daily life, relationships, and overall wellbeing. This overdependence can manifest in various forms, such as social media, gaming, pornography, and compulsive web browsing.

Youth, defined as individuals aged 15-24, are particularly susceptible to internet overdependence due to their ongoing developmental stage, characterized by significant physical, emotional, cognitive, and social-behavioral changes. In Malaysia, it has been estimated that the prevalence of behavioral addiction among youth could be as high as 60.7% in cross-sectional studies involving young participants from Malaysian public universities.

Risk Factors

Various risk factors can contribute to the development of internet overdependence among youth. Some of these factors include:

ADHD (Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder):

Youth with ADHD may be more susceptible to developing internet overdependence due to their difficulty to resist the instant gratification and constant stimulation provided by online activities. Additionally, those with ADHD often struggle with attention regulation and may find the engaging nature of the internet more appealing than other activities. Time management issues, another common challenge for individuals with ADHD, can lead to excessive time spent online. Some youth with ADHD may use the internet as a coping mechanism to escape challenges, such as social difficulties and academic struggles. Furthermore, self-regulation difficulties associated with ADHD can cause problems in setting limits and adhering to boundaries around internet use. It is important to recognize that not all youth with ADHD will develop internet overdependence, and proper management of ADHD symptoms can help reduce the risk of this issue. Therefore, early intervention and support are the key to addressing internet overdependence among ADHD-affected youth.

Social Isolation Or Loneliness:

Young people who feel isolated or disconnected from their peers may turn to the internet as a means to find companionship, social interaction, and a sense of belonging, which can lead to overdependence.

Low Self-Esteem:

Youth with low self-esteem may be more vulnerable to internet overdependence as they seek validation and acceptance through online activities, particularly on social media. The pursuit of "likes" can become an unhealthy obsession, with individuals associating their self-worth with the number of likes and positive feedback they receive. This reliance on social media can lead to preoccupation with their online image and reputation. The curated nature of social media exacerbates low self-esteem, as youth compare themselves to others who seem to lead perfect lives. This creates a distorted perception of reality and pressure to present an idealized version of themselves to gain acceptance. As a result, they may invest significant time and energy in maintaining their online personas, negatively impacting their mental health, social connections, and overall well-being.

Mental health issues:

Conditions such as anxiety, depression, or other mood disorders can increase the risk of excessive internet use, as individuals may turn to the internet as a coping mechanism or escape from their difficulties.

> Family dynamics:

A lack of parental supervision or support, poor communication, or family conflicts can contribute to a young person's overdependence on the internet, as they may seek solace and comfort in the virtual world.

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A Peer influence:


If a young person's friends or social circle are heavily involved in online activities or exhibit excessive internet use, they may be more likely to develop overdependence themselves due to the influence of their peers.

Poor coping skills:

Some youth may struggle with effective coping strategies to manage stress, including academic pressures. In response, they may turn to the internet as an escape, potentially leading to overdependence. The constant stimulation and instant gratification provided by online activities may offer temporary relief from stress, but excessive internet use can exacerbate existing issues and contribute to further difficulties in coping with life challenges. Developing healthy coping skills and stress management techniques is crucial for youth to avoid internet overdependence as a means of escaping stressors.

Accessibility:

Easy access to the internet through multiple devices, such as smartphones, tablets, and computers, can increase the likelihood of developing internet overdependence, as it becomes easier to engage in excessive online activities.



Severe Consequences and Future Projections

If left unaddressed, internet overdependence among youth can have severe consequences and is associated with various mental health disorders and psychological distress:

- Worsening social skills: Overreliance on online interactions can lead to a decline in face-toface social skills, as youth may become less adept at navigating real-life social situations. For instance, young people today might feel more comfortable texting or engaging in virtual meetings rather than interacting in person. This shift in communication preferences can contribute to feelings of loneliness and disconnection, making it increasingly difficult for them to form and maintain meaningful offline relationships.
- 2. Occupational and academic function impairment: Excessive internet use can impair concentration and focus, negatively affecting both academic performance and occupational functioning. This decline in productivity and ability to meet responsibilities can limit future opportunities and hinder young people's success in school, work, and other areas of life.
- 3. Mental health disorders: Internet overdependence has been linked to increased rates of anxiety, depression, low self-esteem, and self-harming behaviours. Excessive internet use can exacerbate feelings of anxiety, particularly social anxiety, and contribute to a decline in mood and an increase in depressive symptoms. In individuals with ADHD, constant stimulation from the internet can worsen attention and focus issues.
- 4. Physical health problems: Sedentary behaviour and poor sleep hygiene associated with excessive internet use can result in obesity, sleep disorders, and other health issues.
- 5. Spiritual disconnect: Overdependence on the internet can distract young people from their faith, hindering their relationship with God and spiritual growth.

Intervention Strategies

When a parent, teacher, or other adult becomes aware of a young person's internet overdependence, it can be challenging to know how to proceed. How can one know if the youth have a problem? Should they be confronted, disciplined, or left to their own devices? It is important to approach this issue with care, seeking guidance from God and the Holy Spirit.

Many adults believe that young people who are overdependent on the internet are simply lacking in self-control and motivation. They may suggest that the young person needs to strengthen their relationship with God and exercise more willpower to overcome their addiction. However, while this approach may be effective for some, the majority of young people who struggle with internet overdependence need professional help to overcome their condition.

Matthew 19:26, remind us that with God, all things are possible, thus we must rely on His strength to address this issue. Intervening with a young person who has internet overdependence can be difficult and hurtful. The young person may deny that they have a problem and become defensive.

Prayer is an essential starting point for parents and other adults who want to help young people with internet overdependence. As Philippians 4:6-7 says, "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." It is important to ask God for guidance and wisdom in approaching this sensitive issue.

Added to prayer, careful words and actions must follow. In cases like this, what we DON'T do is as important as what we should do.

- 1. Don't ignore the problem or make excuses for the young person.
- 2. Don't take over their responsibilities or treat them like a child. Galatians 6:5 says, "For each one should bear his own load."
- 3. Avoid emotional appeals, which may only increase feelings of guilt and shame.
- 4. Don't confiscate or hide their devices or limit their access without a clear plan for help.
- 5. Don't shelter the young person from situations where internet use is present.
- 6. Don't argue with the young person when they are using the internet excessively.
- 7. Above all, don't accept responsibility for the young person's actions or blame yourself for their behaviour.

Attitudes and behaviours which we should avoid include:

- Judgmental or accusatory tones.
- Stigmatizing the young person or their behaviour.
- Seeking sympathy or attention for ourselves
- Blaming ourselves for the young person's behaviour.

There are, however, some important things that we can do to deal more effectively with a young person who has internet overdependence.

- 1. Firm explain why excessive internet use can be harmful, and the importance of creating a balance, as highlighted by Ellen G. White in her teachings on self-control.
- 2. Understanding listen to the reasons why they use the internet excessively. This can be difficult to do, but it is important to maintain a level of trust and convey a sense of acceptance.
- 3. Supportive assist the young person in finding help and provide moral support through tough times ahead.

Addressing internet overdependence among youth requires a thoughtful, compassionate, and faith-based approach. As parents, teachers, and mentors, we must recognize the power of God to help us overcome any challenge, including internet overdependence.

Ultimately, our goal should be to help youth achieve a healthy balance in their lives, harnessing the power of the internet without becoming enslaved to its temptations.

To accomplish this, we must provide firm guidance, understanding, and support, grounded in the wisdom of scriptures and implemented by faith. As we walk alongside our youth in their journey, promoting healthy growth and preventing internet overdependence, we must remember that, with God's help, they can overcome the challenges they face and lead spiritually enriching lives.

HOPE for MALAYSIA 2023

On 11 December 2022 the Peninsular Malaysia Mission's Executive Committee voted to be part of the city-wide evangelistic effort, an effort the reach the cities in these last days. The collaboration with Malaysia Union Mission (MAUM), the Southern Asia-Pacific Division (SSD) and Adventist World Radio (AWR) enabled speakers like, Pastor Kent Sharpe, Vice President Finance, AWR, Pastor Segundino Asoy, Sabbath School & Personal Ministries and Possibilities Ministry Director, SSD, Pastor Verse Fernandez, France Nord, Paris, France and Pastor Roseller Zamora, Adventist World Radio Coordinator, to speak at these series with the overarching theme, 'Revelation of Hope' which ran concurrently.

1,200 representatives from 25 different congregations, across 4 different language groups, attended the culmination of the event on 26 August 2023 at Wisma MCA,

Kuala Lumpur. At Johor 120 people gathered together on the same date.

Starting from 20 August 2023, 4 churches hosted the daily meetings: Kuala Lumpur English, with an average attendance of 120 people, Myanmar congregation, with an average attendance of 150 people and Petaling Jaya English with an average attendance of close to 70 people. At Johor, the meetings ran from 21 to 2626 August 2023. Johor Bahru BM, Megah Ria and Kluang BM hosted the nightly meetings at the former Home Health Education Service Office. They had an attendance of up to 100 people each night.

In all the locations, the main organizers emphasized the success was due to the unity shown among members collaborating together and the daily prayer organized among the church members, months prior to the event, asking for

the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the speakers and all who would be coming for the event. Pastor Renie Ubara, Ministerial & Field Secretary who was coordinating the efforts in Johor shared that Pastor Asoy, invited the participants to pray with him every night and also makes alter calls for special prayers at the end of each nightly meeting.

Intern pastor, Pastor Caleb Wee, witnessed 'many of my fellow ministers, with much more experience and understanding, bring this evangelistic series to fruition'. He said he was humbled to see the cohesiveness and unity between ministers, leaders and laymen, all who were doing great work to ensure that everything ran smoothly. He further added, 'It warmed my heart to see the many church members who came in support of the local church event and their interaction with the friends and guests that we have over'.

Kuala Lumpur English church pastor, Pastor Rober Liaw said that he expected between 50-70 people to come for the nightly meetings but was rebuked by the Holy Spirit when 100 people came on the first night and the number kept increasing up to 150 on Friday night.

Petaling Jaya English church pastor, Pastor Robert Agustin organizer, felt the goodness of God as he was surrounded by many committed, passionate pastors and lay members working together rallying each other to invite members to bring friends to the event.

Food was provided for attendees at all locations and the opportunity to eat together gave members a time to catch up with members from other churches and with seekers who came to eat together. While some seekers may find being amidst strangers intimidating, it was also a good opportunity for seekers to know that the church they are attending is part of a larger organization. Even on Sabbath, tasty, vegan food was provided.

At Kuala Lumpur English, the Newstart Kitchen, an Adventist-run restaurant, located at the ground floor of the church building opened its doors to provide dinner to all attendees of the nightly meetings. Prior to the event, customers who ate at the restaurant were all invited to attend the series and one of the customers attended every single night.





Klang Valley Region Health Expo 2023

Praise God for the 2023 Klang Valley Region Health Expo that was held on 21 May 2023, at Eve Suite Concourse Area, near Damansara Adventist Hope Center (DAHC) at Ara Damansara. 162 people were served on this date.

This was organized by the PEM Health Ministries Department in collaboration with the Damansara Adventist Hope Center. The purpose was to raise awareness about the importance maintaining good health and channelling the participants through a follow up program. The expo was a testament to the hard work and dedication of many volunteers from Klang Valley Churches (30 from DAHC, 11 from SAHC. 6 from Bukit Jelutona. 4 from Puchong Indian and PJ Chinese, 3 from Petaling Jaya English, 2 from Kuala Lumpur English, 3 from Sungai Way and 3 staff from AENON), who assisted in running the event smoothly.

The expo offered a wide range of free health services to the visitors including, check-up for blood pressure, blood sugar, body fat, visceral fat, calculation of BMI/ weight, step test and health counselling. The results of these tests were able to give visitors important insights for their current health status. Visitors were able to understand the importance of maintaining a healthy lifestyle, and how to make lifestyle changes that can help improve their overall health and wellbeing.

Another valuable service offered at the expo was breast examination by the Breast Cancer Welfare Association Malaysia (BCWA). BCWA is a non-profit organization that provides education, support, and assistance to women with breast cancer. The organization's representatives were on hand at the expo to provide visitors with free breast examinations. Their presence at the expo grants the visitors opportunity for free breast examinations as well as learning in depth about the importance of breast health and early detection of breast cancer.

In addition, the expo also gained much interest among the visitors thanks to Dr. Raymond Tah Kheng Soon from Penang Adventist Hospital. Dr. Raymond Tah is a renowned eye specialist with years of experience in the field of ophthalmology. Visitors had the opportunity to consult with Dr. Tah and get valuable insights into their eye health. Some participants were diagnosed with cataracts and were referred to the hospital for further treatment.

Another popular service at the expo was the physiotherapist consultation by our physiotherapist from DAHC, Brother Japdip Singh. This certified physiotherapist himself, found it very satisfying and fulfilling to participate in this event as he offered free consultations and therapy to the visitors. Many participants were excited to have the opportunity to consult with a physiotherapist and were able to

get valuable advice on how to improve their physical health.

In addition to health checkups and consultations, the expo also featured a cooking demo. This was a fun and interactive session where visitors were able to learn about healthy cooking practices and how to make nutritious meals at home. The demo was conducted by Savor Of life Team and Sister Marcia Rajakumar who shared tips and tricks for cooking healthy, delicious vegetarian meals. Free food samples and take-home recipe cards were given out to visitors so that they could try the recipes at home.

The 'Quit Smoking' booth was explained by Sister Jasnah Makirim and Sister Agnes Chang, who provided visitors with information about the dangers of smoking. Visitors were able to discern the adverse effects on smoking along with the assistance of bunting, formalin specimen and "smoking Sam" demonstrations.

Another station that caught the eyes of the visitors was the hydrotherapy treatment station. Hydrotherapy is a form of therapy that uses water to promote physical and mental wellbeing. The expo featured a hydrotherapy booth where visitors were sent to by the counsellor if there were experiencing any health issues.

Hydrotherapy can help improve circulation, reduce stress, and alleviate pain. Visitors were able to try out different hydrotherapy techniques, such hot foot bath and hot/cold fomentation. The participants were taught how to do the hydrotherapy enabling them to continue at home.

Massage therapy was also available. Massage therapy promotes relaxation and alleviates muscle tension and stress. Visitors were able to receive free chair massages.

The Klang Valley Region Health Expo 2023 conducted a survey to gather feedback and learn the preferences of the visitors as potential follow up program with them to maintain their wellbeing.

The survey reports:

- 65 visitors expressed interest in attending health seminars
- 78 visitors were interested in joining exercise programs
- 34 of the visitors were interested in joining cooking classes.

We praise God for sending us all the volunteers. A total of 4,000 flyers was given away to the various community around the neighbourhoods.

In preparation for this expo, certain days were set aside to pray specifically for God's guidance and providence for the event. Indeed, God answers prayers, as the weather was good (even thought it was raining in the morning, it stopped just in time for the event) and many participants attended this event. Despite the success of the health expo, we hope to have an additional booth that addresses issues pertaining to mental health in the near future.

We hope that as we help the community to be aware of their health, the door for sharing the gospel will be opened. Ellen White quotes in Ministry To The Cities,

"Health Evangelism Open Doors for sharing the Gospel....Do medical missionary work. Thus, you will gain access to the hearts of the people. The way will prepare for more decided proclamation of the truth. You will find that relieving their physical suffering gives an opportunity to minister to their spiritual needs." MTC 132.2.

With this in mind, we seek your prayers that through health evangelism we would be able to reach out to more people who would be led to know the true God and to minister to their physical, mental, and spiritual needs.

Nama saya Luther Lumbidau. Saya seorang Literature Evangelist PEM. Rakan sepelayanan saya adalah, Saudara Lorence Abusang. Bersamasama dengan Uncle TJ, kami memulakan misi penjangkauan jiwa di kawasan Kajang sejak 1 April 2022. Setelah satu tahun, perkumpulan kecil, kepada keluarga Hindu berjaya dimulakan pada bulan Jun 2023.

Dalam tahun 2022, semasa penjualan seharian kami. kami terdorong mengetuk pintu hati seorang penjaja makanan. Puan Kalai. Belum pun selesai penerangan kami tentang buku 'Makanan Sihat', Puan Kalai segera menyatakan keinginannya untuk memiliki buku tersebut dan sejak itu dengan memegang pesanan Tuhan yang ada tertulis di dalam Matius 10:10-14, kami memutuskan bersarapan pagi di gerai dia, setiap kali berkunjung ke Kajang dengan harapan sebuah hubungan persahabatan dapat dijalinkan.

Melalui Puan Kalai, Tuhan menghubungkan kami dengan sebuah keluarga kaum India. Puan Kalai sebenarnya mahu membantu keluarga ini kerana mengetahui kehidupan mereka yang sangat menyedihkan. Setelah mendengar ceritanya, kami memutuskan untuk mengunjungi bilik sewaan keluarga tersebut.

6 orang ahli keluarga ini termasuk Puan Tila bersama suami, seorang anak istimewa berumur 13 tahun, serta 3 orang anak lain, masing-masing berumur 10 tahun, 6 tahun dan 3 tahun, tinggal bersesak dalam sebuah bilik sewaan kecil yang hanya beralaskan lantai simen untuk tidur.

Suami Puan Tila tidak mempunyai pendapatan tetap, dan Puan Tila tidak dapat bekerja kerana terpaksa menjaga 4 orang anak di rumah. Anak lelakinya yang berumur 10 tahun seharusnya sudah bersekolah tetapi belum lagi bersekolah.

Hati kami tersentuh apabila melihat dan mendengar sendiri keadaan mereka. Bersama-sama dengan Puan Kalai, kami mula beriktiar memindahkan mereka untuk ke rumah sewaan yang lebih selesa dan merancang supaya Puan Tila juga dapat membantu suami menambah pendapatan keluarga dengan harapan mereka dapat memulakan sebuah kehidupan baru yang lebih baik.

Elder Simon Arumugan, selaku elder gereja Kuala Lumpur English juga telah membawa perkara ini untuk pertimbangan lembaga gerejanya. Mereka telah menambahkan sumbangan modal untuk perniagaan sayuran Puan Tila.

Disingkatkan cerita, keluarga ini diberikan sokongan moral, Rohani dan sedikit pertolongan kewangan. Dari sinilah terjalin persahabatan ikhlas deangan keluarga ini. Lalu, mereka menyahut seruan Roh Kudus yang meminta mereka membuka rumah secara rasmi dengan pembukaan kumpulan Care Group di rumah ini.

Sejak itu kami bersama-sama Puan Jasnah Makirim dan suaminya saudara Tonichong Patungan, kami bersama-sama, aktif mengambil bahagian dalam pelayanan Care Group ini.



Kami memohon sokongan doa supaya pelayanan di Kajang mendatangkan hasil sesuai dengan kehendak Tuhan.



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

YOUTH COLUMN

My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am.

Traveling is one of the best activities we can do as children. I am sure that most of us have all traveled at one time or another—either to visit a relative or simply enjoy a vacation somewhere attractive, with our parents, family or friends. Many of those trips were unforgettable, filled with great times so we would always like to repeat them again.

But in the Bible, we have studied that there will come a day when all of us who have accepted Jesus will take a wonderful journey. A trip much more attractive and meaningful than any trip we have made. The trip that will change our lives forever.

Let us take a look at what conditions must be there for a trip to be considered wonderful?

1. WONDERFUL DESTINATION

My dad told me that when he was a little boy traveling by plane was very expensive, so traveling by bus or train was the most convenient alternative. My grandparents, who lived more than 2,000 kilometers away, always traveled to visit the family. Dad said that despite the distance, discomfort and tediousness of the trip, just knowing that the place where they were going to was beautiful and entertaining helped eased the burden of the trip. The anticipation of arriving at the destination where they would have a good time, made them ignore the boredom of traveling more than 28 hours on a bus. The important thing was it was worth the sacrifice.

All of us have been invited to a place worth knowing. Personally, I am very excited to know that Jesus Himself went to prepare a place for me.

John 14:2 tells us, "My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you?" (NIV) We know that Jesus and His Father made this world, a perfect world. It was perfect, not like the world we know today. But, even with all the flaws and problems in the world today, there are many wonderful places on our planet. Can you imagine what this world was like before the entrance of sin? It must have been wonderful. But even as wonderful as it was, the dwellings that Jesus said He would prepare will be even more wonderful.

In 1 Corinthians 2:9, the apostle Paul gives us a glimpse of what God can do on behalf of all those who want to be saved. "However, as it is written: "What no eye has seen, what no ear has heard, and what no human mind has conceived" the things God has prepared for those who love him." (NIV)

Let us do a little exercise:

Close your eyes and remember the most beautiful landscape you have ever seen. Imagine the sound, the sights. Do you desire to be there again?

Something similar can be done when we imagine heaven. Imagining being in Heaven should be a great motivation, which should help us cope with the problems that we may be experiencing in the present.

Have you sung hymn 342 (Spanish Version) Look at the second stanza:

I have dreamed of those beautiful dwellings. That no one has ever seen in this world. Of beauty that cannot be compared For the glory of the Lord is there. Much more beautiful than the sun at sunset Or the reflection of dew on a flower It is that meeting for the redeemed. Well, it was worth it here to fight and win.

2. TRAVEL IN GOOD COMPANY

Another thing that makes a trip wonderful is the people you travel with. Travelling in good company will also make you forget any discomfort the trip may bring. When we travel with those we love and have a good time, the trip becomes easier and shorter.

But how long will the journey to heaven take?

Ellen White wrote: "Together they entered the cloud and for seven days we ascended to the sea of glass, where Jesus drew crowns and held them with His own hand. He also gave us golden harps and victory palms" (First Writings 16)

As we said before, a long trip is endured when you know that the destination is attractive, wonderful, and the sky must surely be very spectacular, to the point that we can hardly imagine it.

But it is also important to know that on this trip you and I can be accompanied by nice, well-known and beloved people, people who would make the trip even more wonderful.

Who is our company?

- 1. Our Family
- 2. Our relatives who died but who went down to rest believing in Jesus
- 3. Our friends
- 4. The members of my unit
- 5. The people to whom we have presented the message of salvation.

That's right, when Christ comes, all our acquaintances who have accepted Jesus as their personal Savior will be part of our company. The Bible also tells us that those who died believing in Jesus will be resurrected, that is, if you lost a friend or family member, if they accepted Jesus before they died, they will rise again and will also be part of our journey, contributing to make our journey to heaven wonderful.

1 Thessalonians 4:16-18 says, "For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. 17 After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. 18 Therefore encourage one another with these words." (NIV)

Can you imagine what this will mean!

3. JESUS THE BEST HOST

We have already looked at two requirements to having a wonderful trip. The first is that the destination has to be beautiful, attractive, and spectacular; the second has to do with who accompanies us on the trip. Having good company makes the trip pleasant and the journey feels short, but what if, the person who has the responsibility of being our host does not make us feel comfortable? A good host can make everything worthwhile, even if the landscape is not so beautiful or the weather is not good. Even if those who travel next to us are not up to the task. Friends, a good host can make you forget all the bad times experienced on a trip. It can relieve our fatigue and boredom. A good host can make the moments unforgettable. On this journey we are taking, the host is Jesus, our Friend and Savior. He himself went to prepare a place for each of us; and if He is the one who is taking care of all the details, we can be sure that He is preparing the best for us.

Let's read John 14:2-3 again: "My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am".

Being with Jesus will mean being in a "Kingdom prepared from the foundation of the world for us" (Matthew 25:34). That Jesus himself, creator of all that surrounds us, has prepared a place for you and me?

Something that is expected of a host, is that the host does everything in their power to serve the guests well. The host must take all the measures so that those who are under their care feel good, happy and, in one way or another, make them forget the bad times experienced in the past.

Knowing that Jesus was resurrected, and then ascended into heaven to prepare the promised dwellings, should motivate us to want to know and enjoy His hospitality. This should fill us with joy and hope.

CONCLUSION

Very soon, those of us who have accepted Jesus with all our hearts, will have the opportunity to embark on a wonderful journey... Yes! A spectacular journey with the destination being the dwellings that Jesus has prepared for us.

And the Bible promised that Heaven, is a wonderful place. On the journey to heaven, we will be surrounded by good people, including friends and family who were resurrected to make this journey and live for eternity where we can enjoy the beauty of a sea of glass and play with all kinds of animals. We will be able to taste delicious fruits, and we will periodically travel to other worlds.

Would you like to make this trip? Do you want to be with Jesus and enjoy His hospitality?

To be on this journey you must be saved, and to be saved you must believe in the Lord Jesus and be baptized. But also, you must be the hands of Jesus in helping others to know Him. All of us who are members of the Seventhday Adventist Church should want to communicate the message of salvation so that many others can make this wonderful journey.

Would you like to make this trip? Do you want to be with Jesus and enjoy His hospitality?
