The Call to Faithfulness

Faithfulness to His Church & Prophetic Movement

"Called, Chosen, and Faithful"

The Seventh-day Adventist Church is a prophetic movement raised by God for these last days. We are not just another denomination; we are a people called for an urgent end-time mission, entrusted with a hopeful message, and guided by the Holy Spirit. Our faithfulness to His church is not just about attendance — it's about commitment to His timeless truth, His selfless mission, and to His glorious coming kingdom.

1. Faithfulness to His Church – A Divine Calling

The church is not man-made; it is God's ordained instrument for spreading the gospel. Jesus declared in Matthew 16:18, "On this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it." This church is built on Christ, and nothing can destroy it! We are:

- A movement of prophecy – Rooted in the unfailing prophecies of Daniel and Revelation.

Panggilan untuk Kesetiaan

Kesetiaan kepada Gereja-Nya & Gerakan Nubuatan

“Dipanggil, Dipilih, dan Setia”

Gereja Masehi Advent Hari Ketujuh adalah gerakan nubuatan yang dibangkitkan oleh Tuhan untuk hari-hari terakhir ini. Kita bukan sekadar denominasi lain; kitalah orang yang dipanggil untuk misi zaman akhir yang mendesak, diamanahkan dengan utusan yang penuh harapan, dan dibimbing oleh Roh Kudus. Kesetiaan kita kepada gereja-Nya bukan hanya tentang kehadiran — ia mengenai komitmen kepada kebenaran-Nya yang abadi, misi-Nya yang mengorbankan diri, dan kerajaan mulia-Nya yang akan datang.

1. Kesetiaan kepada Gereja-Nya – Panggilan Ilahi

Gereja bukan buatan manusia; ia merupakan alat yang ditetapkan oleh Tuhan untuk menyebarkan injil. Yesus menyatakan dalam Matius 16:18, “... batu yang kukuh, dengan asas batu pejal inilah akan Kubina jemaah-Ku. Alam maut pun tidak dapat merobohkannya.” Gereja ini dibina di atas Kristus, dan tiada apa yang boleh memusnahkannya! Menurut Wahyu 12:17 dan 14:12, gereja sisa mempunyai ciri-ciri berikut: Mereka taat kepada perintah Tuhan, mempunyai kesaksian Yesus yang merupakan Roh Nubuat (rujuk 19:10) dan beriman kepada Yesus.

Kesetiaan bermaksud:

- Berdiri teguh dalam kebenaran, walaupun dunia menentang kita (2 Timotius 4:2-3).
- Menyokong misi dengan masa, bakat, dan sumber lain kita, contohnya, harta, kesaksian, kebenaran, dll. (Maleakhi 3:10).
- Bersatu dalam kasih dan pelayanan, kerana kita satu tubuh dalam Kristus (Efesus 4:3-6).

2. Gereja Masehi Advent Hari Ketujuh – Gerakan Nubuatan

Gereja Masehi Advent Hari Ketujuh bukanlah suatu kebetulan — ia penggenapan nubuatan. Wahyu 12:17 menggambarkan umat sisa yang “taat kepada perintah Tuhan dan mempunyai kesaksian Yesus Kristus.” Gereja ini sebahagian daripada gerakan nubuatan itu, dipanggil untuk memberitakan Perkhayaban Tiga Malaikat dalam Wahyu 14:6-12, memberi amaran kepada dunia dan menyediakan orang ramai untuk kedatangan Yesus Kristus yang tidak lama lagi.

Kita ialah:

- Gerakan nubuatan — Berasaskan kepada nubuatan Daniel dan Wahyu yang tidak pernah gagal.
- Gerakan bermisi — Dipanggil untuk memberitakan injil kekal yang membawa harapan kepada setiap bangsa.

- Gerakan harapan — Mengisytiharkan kedatangan kembali Tuhan kita Yesus Kristus yang akan memulihkan segalanya.

3. Setia Hingga Akhir

Dalam Wahyu 2:10, Yesus berkata, “Setialah sampai mati, maka Aku akan menganugerahimu mahkota hidup sebagai ganjaran kemenangan.”

Kesetiaan kita kepada gereja-Nya bukanlah sementara — ia adalah satu komitmen sepanjang hayat. Kita mesti tetap teguh, berpegang kepada kebenaran, menegaskan identiti nubuatan kita, dan berkongsi utusan keselamatan.

Kesimpulan

Tuhan telah memanggil kita untuk menjadi sebahagian daripada gereja zaman akhir-Nya. Dia telah memberi kita satu misi, satu tujuan, dan satu harapan yang menjangkau dunia ini. Semoga kita tetap setia kepada gereja-Nya, berdedikasi kepada panggilan nubuatan-Nya, dan teguh dalam kebenaran-Nya hingga hari mulia kedatangan Kristus.

Marilah kita bangkit menyahut panggilan kita dan berkata, “Inilah aku, Tuhan, utuslah aku!” (Yesaya 6:8)

ஏழாம் நாள் அட்வென்டிஸ்ட் சபை என்பது இந்தக் கடைசி நாட்களுக்காக தேவனால் எழுப்பப்பட்ட ஒரு தீர்க்கதரிசன இயக்கமாகும். நாம் வெறும் மற்றொரு பிரிவு அல்ல; நாம் ஒரு அவசர இறுதி நேரப் பணிக்காக அழைக்கப்பட்ட மக்கள், நம்பிக்கையுடனும் செய்தியுடன் ஒப்படைக்கப்பட்டு, பரிசுத்த ஆவியால் வழிநடத்தப்படுகிறோம். அவருடைய திருச்சபைக்கு நாம் உண்மையாக இருப்பது வெறும் வருகையைப் பற்றியது அல்ல - அது அவருடைய காலமற்ற சத்தியத்திற்கும், அவருடைய தன்னலமற்ற பணிக்கும், அவருடைய மகிமையாய் வரவிருக்கும் ராஜ்யத்திற்கும் அர்ப்பணிப்பைப் பற்றியது.

1. அவருடைய திருச்சபையின் மீதுள்ள விசுவாசம் - தெய்வீக அழைப்பு

சபை மனிதனால் உருவாக்கப்பட்டதல்ல; அது நற்செய்தியைப் பரப்புவதற்கு தேவனால் நியமிக்கப்பட்ட கருவியாகும். மத்தேயு 16:18 இல் இயேசு அறிவித்தார், "இந்தக் கல்லின் மேல் நான் என் திருச்சபையைக் கட்டுவேன், பாதாளத்தின் வாசல்கள் அதை வெல்லாது." இந்த திருச்சபை கிறிஸ்துவின் மேல் கட்டப்பட்டுள்ளது, அதை எதுவும் அழிக்க முடியாது! வெளிப்படுத்துதல் 12:17 மற்றும் 14:12 இன் படி, மீதமுள்ள திருச்சபை பின்வரும் பண்புகளைக் கொண்டுள்ளது: அவர்கள் கடவுளின் கட்டளைகளைக் கடைப்பிடிக்கிறார்கள், தீர்க்கதரிசன ஆவியான இயேசுவின் சாட்சியத்தைக் கொண்டுள்ளனர் (cf. 19:10, KJV) மற்றும் இயேசுவின் விசுவாசத்தைக் கொண்டுள்ளனர் (KJV). விசுவாசம் என்றால்:

- உலகம் நமக்கு எதிராக இருந்தாலும், சத்தியத்தில் உறுதியாக நிற்பது (2 தீமோத்தேயு 4:2-3).
- நமது நேரம், திறமைகள், பொக்கிஷங்கள், சாட்சியம், சத்தியம், ஆலயம் ஆகியவற்றால் பணியை ஆதரித்தல். (மல்கியா 3:10).
- நாம் கிறிஸ்துவின் சரீரமாக இருப்பதால், அன்பிலும் சேவையிலும் ஒன்றுபட்டிருத்தல் (எபேசியர் 4:3-6).

2. ஏழாம் நாள் அட்வென்டிஸ்ட் சபை - ஒரு தீர்க்கதரிசன இயக்கம்
ஏழாம் நாள் அட்வென்டிஸ்ட் சபை ஒரு தற்செயல் நிகழ்வு அல்ல - அது தீர்க்கதரிசனத்தின் நிறைவேற்றம். வெளிப்படுத்துதல் 12:17,

"தேவனுடைய கட்டளைகளைக் கைக்கொண்டு இயேசு கிறிஸ்துவின் சாட்சியத்தைப் பெற்ற" ஒரு மீதமுள்ள மக்களை விவரிக்கிறது. இந்த சபை வெளிப்படுத்துதல் 14:6-12 இன் முத்துதின் செய்திகளை அறிவிக்க அழைக்கப்பட்ட அந்த தீர்க்கதரிசன இயக்கத்தின் ஒரு பகுதியாகும், உலகை எச்சரித்து, இயேசு கிறிஸ்துவின் உடனடி வருகைக்கு மக்களை தயார்படுத்துகிறது.

நாம்:

□ தீர்க்கதரிசன இயக்கம் - தானியேல் மற்றும் வெளிப்படுத்துதலின் தோல்வியடையாத தீர்க்கதரிசனங்களில் வேரூன்றியுள்ளது.

□ ஒரு பணி இயக்கம் - ஒவ்வொரு தேசத்திற்கும் நம்பிக்கையைக் கொண்டுவரும் நித்திய நற்செய்தியைப் பிரசங்கிக்க அழைக்கப்பட்டது.

□ நம்பிக்கை இயக்கம் - எல்லாவற்றையும் மீட்டெடுக்கும் நமது கர்த்தராகிய இயேசு கிறிஸ்துவின் வருகையை அறிவித்தல்.

3. இறுதிவரை விசுவாசம் வெளிப்படுத்துதல் 2:10-ல், இயேசு கூறுகிறார், "நீ மரணபரியந்தம் உண்மையாயிரு, அப்பொழுது ஜீவகிரீடத்தை உனக்குத் தருவேன்." அவருடைய திருச்சபைக்கு நாம் உண்மையாக இருப்பது தற்காலிகமானது அல்ல - அது வாழ்நாள் முழுவதும் அர்ப்பணிப்பு. நாம் உறுதியாக இருந்து, சத்தியத்தைப் பற்றிக்கொண்டு, நமது தீர்க்கதரிசன அடையாளத்தை நிலைநிறுத்தி, இரட்சிப்பின் செய்தியைப் பகிர்ந்து கொள்ள வேண்டும்.

முடிவுரை
தேவன் நம்மை அவருடைய இறுதிக்கால சபையின் ஒரு பகுதியாக இருக்க அழைத்திருக்கிறார். அவர் நமக்கு ஒரு பணி, ஒரு நோக்கம் மற்றும் இந்த உலகத்தை மீறும் நம்பிக்கையை அளித்துள்ளார். நாம் அவருடைய சபைக்கு உண்மையாக இருப்போம், அவருடைய தீர்க்கதரிசன அழைப்புக்கு அர்ப்பணிப்போம், கிறிஸ்துவின் வருகையின் மகிமையான நான் வரை அவருடைய சத்தியத்தில் உறுதியாக இருப்போம்.

நாம் எழுந்து நின்று, "இதோ, நான் இருக்கிறேன், ஆண்டவரே, என்னை அனுப்பு!" (ஏசாயா 6:8) என்று கூறுவோமாக.

忠诚的呼召 忠于祂的教会和预言性运动

基督复临安息日会是上帝为末世兴起的预言性运动。我们并非一个普通的教派；我们是一群蒙召去完成末世紧急使命的人，被委托传扬充满希望的信息，并有圣灵的引导。我们对于上帝教会的忠心不仅仅在于出席聚会——而是在乎委身于祂永恒的真理、祂无私的使命，以及祂荣耀的国度降临。

1. 忠于祂的教会——神圣的呼召
教会并非人造的；它是上帝所命定的传扬福音的工具。耶稣在马太福音16:18中宣告：“我要把我的教会建造在这磐石上，阴间的权柄不能胜过它”。这教会建造在基督身上，没有任何事物能够摧毁它！根据启示录12:17和14:12，余民教会具有以下特征：他们是遵守上帝的诫命，为耶稣作见证的，即是预言之灵（参见启19:10）和耶稣的真道。

忠诚意味着：

1) 即使面对世界的反对，我们也要

坚定地站在真理的立场上（提摩太后书 4:2-3）。

2) 善用我们的时间、才能和其他的资源（例如财富、见证、真理等）来支持我们的使命（玛拉基书 3:10）。

3) 在爱与服侍中合一，因为我们是基督的身体（以弗所书 4:3-6）。

2. 基督复临安息日会——一个预言性的运动

基督复临安息日会的出现并非偶然——它是预言的应验。启示录12:17 描述了一群“遵守上帝诫命，为耶稣基督作见证”的余民。这个教会是这预言运动的一部分，蒙召宣扬启示录 14:6-12 中的三天使信息，警告世人，并预备人们迎接耶稣基督即将的复临。

我们是：

- 预言的运动——根植于但以理书和启示录中永不落空的预言。
- 宣教的运动——蒙召传扬永恒的福音，为每个国家带来希望。

- 希望的运动——宣告我们的主耶稣基督即将再来，祂将复兴万物。

3. 忠心到底

在启示录2:10，耶稣说：“你务要至死忠心，我就赐给你那生命的冠冕。”我们对祂教会的忠心不是暂时的，而是终生的承诺。我们必须坚定不移，持守真理，维护我们的预言身份，并分享救恩的信息。

结论

上帝呼召我们成为祂末世教会的一部分。祂赋予我们一个使命，一个目标，和一个超越这个世界的盼望。愿我们忠于祂的教会，献身于祂预言的呼召，并在祂的真理中坚定不移，直到基督再来的荣耀之日。

让我们兴起，回应我们的呼召，说：“耶和華啊，我在这里，求你差遣我！”（以赛亚书6:8）

Unity, Our Visible Faithfulness for Church Growth

When we think and discuss faithfulness to God's church and prophetic movement, there is one essential characteristic that every believing Adventist should manifest—unity in God or oneness in God. On the contrary, if we nurture disunity among us Adventists, it shows that sinful worldly influences are still controlling our minds and actions. Ellen White writes, "Christian unity is a mighty agency. It tells in a powerful manner that those who possess it are children of God. It has an irresistible influence upon the world, showing that man in his humanity may be a partaker of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. We are to be one with our fellow men and with Christ, and in Christ one with God. Then of us can be spoken the words, "Ye are complete in Him."'" (White, 1874).

Our unity in faithfulness to His church and prophetic movement should be encompassing all areas of church life. This unity is accomplished when the Holy Spirit is with God's true believers, "endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4:3). Each one although different but uphold oneness and faithfully do their duties within the body of Christ for the sake of the entire. When we understand and practice this, then the desired church



growth will organically occur. That desired growth is a blessing from God, the Owner of the church. The pen of inspiration deepened the meaning of such unity through these beautiful thoughts: “God calls upon the members of His church to receive the Holy Spirit, to come together in unity and brotherly sympathy, to bind their interests together in love... Nothing so manifestly weakens a church as disunion and strife. Nothing so wars against Christ and the truth as this spirit... He in whose heart Christ abides recognizes Christ abiding in the heart of his brother. Christ never wars against Christ. Christ never exerts an influence against Christ. Christians are to do their work, whatever it may be, in the unity of the Spirit, for the perfecting of the whole body. (White, 1874).

The Secret of Family and Church Unity

Unity and mission is one. If one of them is missing, the other will not exist. The pen of inspiration explains this clearly, “The solemn, earnest prayer of Christ ... reaches down along the line to our time. What a position is this for a fallen man to attain through obedience—oneness with God through Jesus Christ!... The most convincing argument we can give to the world of Christ’s mission is to be found in perfect unity.... In proportion to our unity with Christ will be our power to save souls.” (White, 1961).

Now, let’s learn the secret of unity in the family and in the church. Ellen White illustrated it beautifully, “Picture a large circle, from the edge of which are many lines all running to the centre. The nearer these lines approach the centre, the nearer they are to one another. The cause of division and discord in families and in the church is separation from Christ. To come near to Christ is to come near to one another. The secret of true unity in the church and in the family is not diplomacy, not management, not a superhuman effort to overcome difficulties—though there will be much of this to do—but union with Christ.” (White, 1952).

A Call To Be United In Mission

We have a big task to finish the Gospel work in Peninsular Malaysia. This vast field has many people groups that have not yet heard the Advent message. Faithfulness and unity must lead to active mission work among Adventists in PEM. Many people in Peninsular Malaysia are disconnected from faith and caught up in materialism. The church must be missional in all of its ministries, using technology, social media, publishing, health, community service outreach as means for friendship ministry. Medical missionary work and

community services can open doors for evangelism. Peninsular Malaysia, as a melting pot of cultures, is also a place of religious diversity. Sharing faith in a legally restricted environment requires wisdom and Christlike love. Friendship evangelism, health programs, and education can introduce Adventist values to others. Ellen White on reaching the unreached writes, “We are not to wait for souls to come to us; we must seek them out where they are.” (White, 1925).

Practical Steps for Church Growth and Unity

As a church that is called to proclaim the truth, we need missional strategic steps. First, strengthening the local church. A growing church begins with a spiritually strong congregation. Churches should focus on fostering a culture of prayer and revival, develop discipleship programs to train new members, and encourage every member’s involvement in ministry and mission (TMI).

Second, emphasising on Small Group Ministry by focusing on discipleship, in-depth Bible study, and leadership development. We are in a business of making workers for God and not just believers. People from other cultures and religions are more open to join small group ministry compared to joining church. We encourage all local churches in PEM to have a strong Small Group Ministry. And third, colportaging, expanding medical, educational, Adventist Community Services (ACS), sidewalk ministry, campus mission work, etc. For example, Health ministries (lifestyle programs, clinics), Community Services, Sidewalk ministry and campus ministries can open doors for the gospel. Adventist education can influence young minds with Christian values. ACS can build long-lasting friendship. For example, not long ago, through the collaborative work of PEM Publishing Ministries and Setapak Adventist Fellowship (SAF) small group ministry, an entire family was introduced to the gospel, their needs were fulfilled and two of the members of the family were baptised recently, and others were having Bible studies.

On top of that, the family’s personal encounter with God has encouraged them to introduce the church to their friends. Therefore, the aim of the different outreach ministries of our church is to establish relational witnessing and long lasting friendship and relationship with others, preparing for Jesus’ second coming.

A Call to Faithfulness and Unity

Faithfulness to God’s Church and its prophetic mission is vitally essential for every Seventh-day Adventists in Peninsular Malaysia. We are living in the end times, Adventists must stand firm in biblical truth, remain committed to their mission, and work together in unity to reach the unreached. Faithfulness ensures we remain rooted in God’s truth and do not compromise. Unity allows us to work effectively and bring the gospel to all people groups in Peninsular Malaysia. Ellen White’s words summarize this mission well, “The work of God in this earth can never be finished until the men and women comprising our church membership rally to the work, and unite their efforts with those of ministers and church officers.” (White, 1991).

May we, as Adventists in Peninsular Malaysia, stay faithful, remain united, and finish the work, so that all may hear the gospel, and we may see Jesus return soon. Prayerfully, let us not stop collaborating with and in the Holy Spirit, and among us Adventists for church growth. Our faithfulness and unity should be visible. This is a beautiful testimony of God’s love living in us that others will witness.

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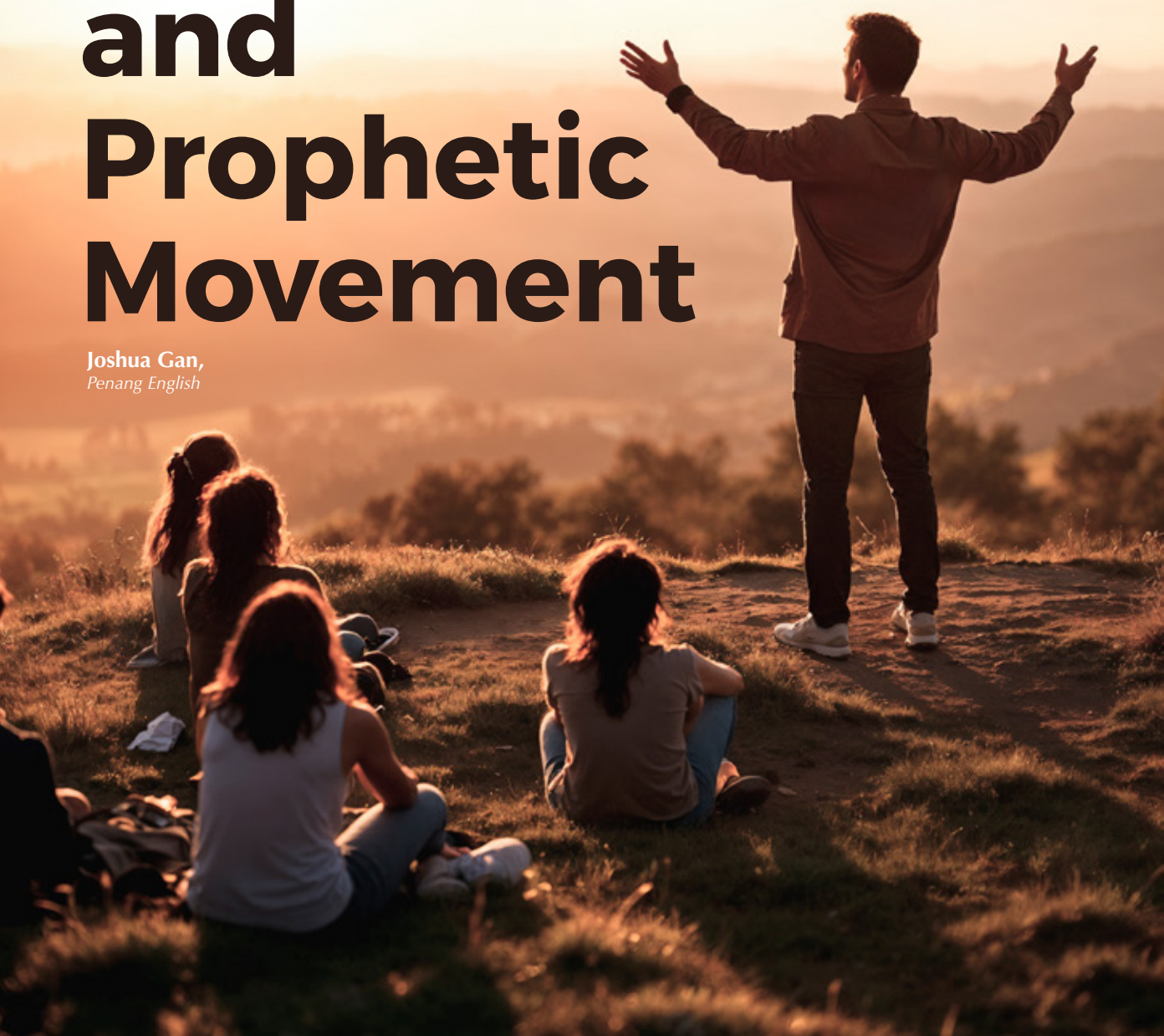

God's Call to Faithfulness

At this 11th hour of Planet Earth, many events of our world are rushing to fulfil end-time Bible prophecies. Satan is fully aware of the fact that his time is running out. With his demonic influence in every corner of the world, he expends every ounce of his energy in attempting to prevent God from preparing a people who willingly uphold His present truths and advance His prophetic movement. Therefore, the "Call to Faithfulness" refers to God's tender appeal to all members of Seventh-day Adventist Church to remain loyal to Him by being committed to living out His truths and advancing His Advent Movement.

Faithfulness to God's Church

Jesus says, "...I will build My church, and the **gates of Hades shall not prevail against it** (Matthew 16:18)." This declaration of Christ is crystal clear. The evil forces of darkness shall not overcome **His church!** Jesus refers to His church as singular, **only one church** – the one that **He builds**, not many so-called churches as we see today. How did this happen?

About 2000 years ago, God prophesied how this would happen. In the sixth chapter of Revelation, He tells us in His prophecy that, historically, when the first seal was opened the apostolic church was a **white** horse, symbolizing purity in its Christian beliefs. The bow and crown signify its victory in spreading the gospel (Revelation 6:2). However, later it became a **black** horse and then a **pale** horse (Revelation 6:5-8). This happened when the church leaders began compromising true beliefs of the church with elements of paganism to the extent that the "church" became pale and was dying spiritually. In 2 Thessalonians 2:1-4, God describes how far the "church" had fallen away during the dark ages of its apostasy. With the arrival of spiritual awakening and religious protests, the "church" persecuted and martyred many faithful Christians (Revelation 6:9-11). All this led to the formation of many protestant churches. Nevertheless, the reformation in these churches did not restore them from the pale horse of the apostate church to the white horse of the apostolic church. They still retain some of the pagan elements in their Christian beliefs till this day.

Finally, God raised the Seventh-day Adventist Church and named it officially in 1863. Through the guidance of the Holy Spirit and the visions He gave to Ellen White, our pioneers studied the Scriptures and came to accept the fundamental beliefs of the Bible. Today, we exist as a worldwide church with a definite mission of calling people out from all places of immorality and spiritual darkness and be the church that Christ builds – the one that Satan is unable to prevail against it. Throughout church history, God always has a faithful people that the forces of darkness are incapable of prevailing. Does God have His faithful people in these last

days? Can we identify ourselves as His end-time faithful people? If we can, it is imperative that we be faithful to the fundamental beliefs and practices of His church in this final hour of last-day events.

Faithfulness to God's Prophetic Movement

It all began when William Miller the Baptist applied the **historicist method** of prophetic interpretation to interpret Daniel 8:14 as predicting Christ's return around 1843 – 1844. When Christ did not return on 22 October 1844, it led to what is now called the **Great Disappointment**. This was the **Millerite Movement** of Revelation 10:10 – I...ate it, and it was **as sweet as honey** in my mouth...when I had eaten it, my stomach became **bitter**. After this bitter experience, many left this movement.

By re-examining the Scriptures, the little flock that remained after the disheartening event was spiritually revived. As they traced the error of their interpretation, they discovered that the date was correct but the event was not the **Second Advent** of Jesus to Planet Earth. They concluded that the "cleansing of the sanctuary" stated in Daniel 8:14 referred to His ministry in the heavenly sanctuary which is the **Investigative Judgment** of Daniel 7:9, 10 and 13. Hence, out of the bitter experience of that movement, **God enlightened** the remnant of that prophetic movement with this biblical understanding, which eventually gave birth to the **Seventh-day Adventist Church** in 1863.

To fulfill the remaining prophecy of Revelation 10 – "You must **prophesy again**" (verse 11) – **God raised up** the Seventh-day Adventist Church to advance this **Advent Movement**. As God **called a person** named Noah to faithfully carry out the work of warning the antediluvian world of the impending flood, He has called a people in these last days to faithfully proclaim the final events to our present world. He gave Noah **one** warning message before that world ended; He gave the Seventh-day Adventist Church **three final messages** before this world of ours must end. Historically, those three angels' messages of Revelation 14:6-12 have been our prophetic mandate:

The First Angel: Proclaims the everlasting gospel and the hour of God's judgment.

The Second Angel: Declares the fall of Babylon – all false worship systems.

The Third Angel: Warns against worshiping the beast and its image.

God has raised us up as a people having faithfulness to His prophetic Advent Movement. Are we heeding His call to faithfulness?



Menopause

What is menopause?

Menopause is a natural part of aging for women and marks the end of your reproductive years. On average, menopause happens at age 51.

The process is gradual and happens in three stages:

Perimenopause or “menopause transition”: Perimenopause can begin eight to 10 years before menopause when your ovaries gradually produce less estrogen. Some women don’t have any menopausal symptoms. For others, they may experience bothersome symptoms such as hot flashes, trouble sleeping, pain during sex, mood swings, irritability, depression, and weight gain.

Menopause: Menopause is the point when you no longer have menstrual periods for 12 consecutive months. At

this stage, your ovaries have stopped releasing eggs and stopped producing most of their estrogen.

Post menopause: This is the time after you haven’t had a period for an entire year or more. During this stage, menopausal symptoms may get better. However, some people continue to experience menopausal symptoms for a decade or longer. As a result of a lower estrogen level, there is also an increased risk for osteoporosis and heart disease.

How can I relieve menopause symptoms?

Although hormone therapy is a very effective method for relieving menopause symptoms, it’s not the perfect treatment for everyone. Non-hormonal treatments include changes to your diet and lifestyle. Making changes to what you eat can help reduce symptoms of hot flashes and night

sweats. A whole-food diet high in fruits, vegetables, whole grains, high quality protein may reduce menopause symptoms. Consuming phytoestrogens and healthy fats, such as omega-3 fatty acids from fish, may also help.

Eat more plants, especially those with phytoestrogens

Phytoestrogens are plant compounds that act in similar ways to estrogen:

- legumes: soybeans
- nuts and seeds: cashews, flaxseeds, sesame seeds
- whole grains: rye, oats, wheat, spelt, buckwheat
- fruits: apricot, pears, grapes, kiwi
- vegetables: bell pepper, green beans, carrots, zucchini, spices, herbs, nuts, and seeds all count as plant-based foods.

Limit foods high in fat and sugar

A diet high in fat and processed sugar can trigger hot flashes, so limiting the amount of sweets and cakes you eat can help.

Non-hormonal treatments include changes to your diet and lifestyle. It can help reduce symptoms of hot flashes and night sweats and reduce menopause symptoms.

Exercise

Working out can be difficult if you're dealing with hot flashes, but exercising can help relieve several other symptoms of menopause and reduce other health risks associated with menopause. You should aim for 150 minutes of moderate intensity exercise per week. This should include a mixture of cardiovascular exercise with at least two strength-building sessions.

Doing cardiovascular exercise will help to improve your heart health after the menopause. Examples include:

- cycling
- high-intensity interval training (HIIT)-style workouts
- running
- brisk walking

Strength exercises reduce the risk of osteoporosis and improve muscle mass. For example:

- bodyweight exercises such as squats, planks, or push ups
- lifting kettlebells, dumbbells, or other weights
- using resistance-based gym machines or resistance bands
- doing stretching and core muscle stability exercises, like pilates

Balance and mobility can sometimes decline during menopause because of a loss of muscle mass. That is why it is also important to include balance and mobility exercises. These types of exercises also involve a mind-body aspect, which may reduce your stress levels and improve some symptoms of menopause.

Avoiding triggers to hot flashes

No caffeine, not smoking, and cutting back on spicy foods can make your hot flashes less severe. Keeping your bedroom cool at night may help too.

What about supplements?

Some people may wish to take supplements to relieve menopausal symptoms. However, there is no clear evidence that dietary supplements can relieve menopause symptoms. Research is lacking on long-term safety of dietary supplements. Some supplements can interact with prescription medications and may cause additional side effects.

2025 PEM SC4C STEWARDSHIP CARAVAN FOR CHRIST 14-20 MARCH 2025

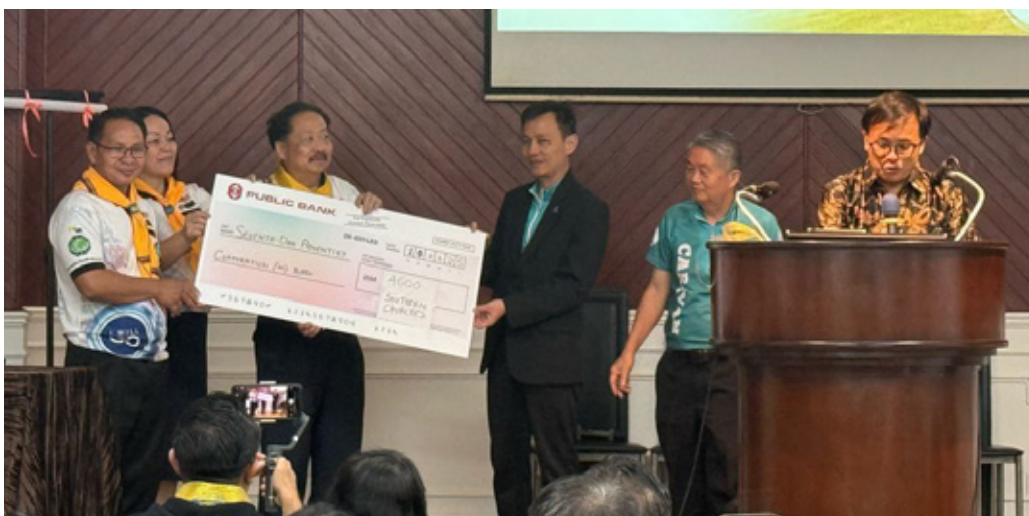

HISTORY of JBBM CHURCH

THE BEGINNING & DEVELOPMENT OF THE CHURCH

In the early 1990s, many members from Sabah, Sarawak, and Indonesia migrated to Johor in search of job opportunities. At that time, Malaysia's manufacturing sector was expanding, providing ample employment opportunities, especially in Johor Bahru. Besides manufacturing workers, there were also government employees and students pursuing their studies at Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM) and other public institutions of higher learning. Christians from the Seventh-day Adventist faith gathered and worshipped together in Johor Bahru. To facilitate services, Sabbath School sessions were conducted separately: English services were held in the Main Church, while services in the native languages were conducted at the Lamb Shelter. However, both groups would come together for worship services.

THE ESTABLISHMENT OF JBBM CHURCH

In 2000, a meeting was held with the English-speaking group, and in September of the same year, the JBBM group conducted its first language-specific worship service. Pastor Joshua Gan, who was then the pastor of the Johor Bahru English Church, played a significant role in initiating the formation of JBBM.

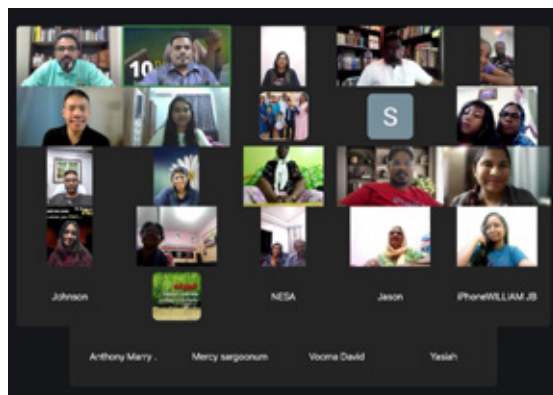

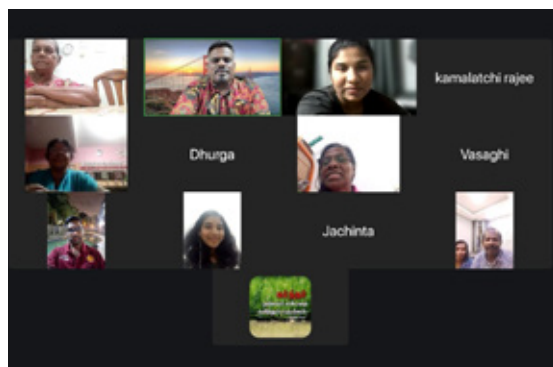

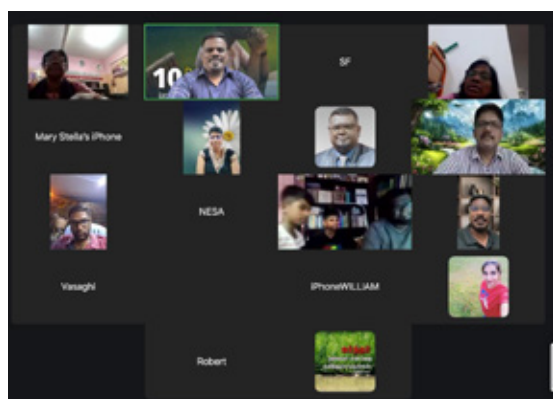

Student LE Canvassing Program

PEM Publishing Ministries organized a Student LE canvassing program for the English and Malay speaking churches from 5-12 February 2025. 11 students from Setapak Fellowship, Johor Bahru English church and Johor Bahru Indian church joined the program. The youngest participant is 11 years old and most senior was 20 years old.

During the program, the 11 students were trained by 4 Literature Evangelists; Brother Tonichong Patungan, Brother Lorence Abusang, Brother Saravanan Nadarajoo and Sister Emily Malar Nellsan, bringing them to canvass for five days. They were also taught to do online selling on social media and to make E-poster for book promotion for their friends and church members.

On the first day of canvassing some of the students were not able to sell a single book, but praise God after five days they have managed to sell 293 books with a total sale of RM6,775.00. The students were also trained to give tracts and pray with their prospects. During the five days, 143 prayers were offered, and 848 tracts were given out.

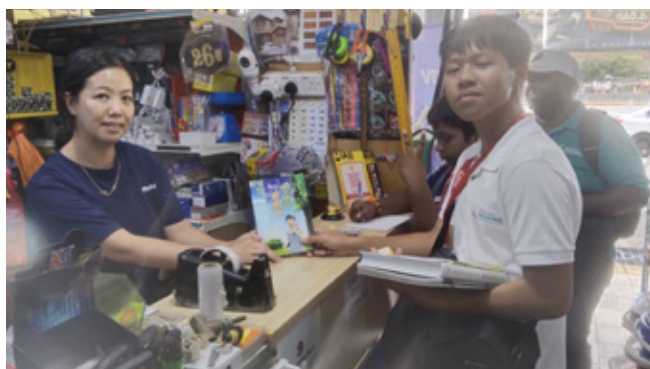
Each day, the students shared their experience of canvassing and many of them learned how to pray, leaning on God when they faced rejection and objection. They were taught to wake up early in the morning to read their Bible and then have a group worship.

Ellen White wrote this “Opportunity for Student Colporteurs—When school closes, there will be opportunity for many to go out into the field as evangelistic canvassers. The faithful colporteur finds his way into many homes, where he leaves precious reading matter containing the truth for this time.”—The Review and Herald, August 27, 1903. - CM 31.1. The canvassing program offers and trains the students to be a good missionary, beside earning pocket money during school holiday. They will get new skills on how to approach people and how to persuade them to accept the truth from our books.

My hope is that more students will join the next student LE program in the Central region in September. Please send your children to join the program.

整个活动虽仅短短 45 分钟，却充满意义。我记得病房中，有一位乐龄病人感动地说：“谢谢你们记得我，让我在孤独中体会新春的祝福”。那一刻我们感受到——真正打动 人心的，不只是物质，而是那份被记得的温暖。医院院长感动地表示，多年来我们在大年初一始终如一地前来探访病患，是对病人最大的支持与鼓励。这份坚持不仅感动 了他们，更让各族人民在节日中感受到彼此之间不分你我的爱与关怀。正如《马太福音》25:35 所说：“我饿了，你们给我吃；我渴了，你们给我喝；我作客旅，你们留我住。”我们所做的每一件善事，都是对主的回应与敬拜。与此同时，本会与合心同善社区关怀团队也于 1 月 24 日至 25 日之间，完成了 150 份乐龄礼包的分派工作，将关怀送达弱势群体与独居长者手中，让他们在新春前夕感受到关爱的温度。

王建益弟兄的见证

在2023年尾，我开始接触基督复临安息日教会隔壁的收留所。这个收留所由梁建成牧师在疫情期间设立，专门照顾残障及独居年老的弟兄姐妹。正是在那时，我认识了王建益弟兄，并了解到他背后那段充满挑战的小城故事。

命运的骤变

王建益弟兄曾是一名专业理发师，在新加坡从事多年，事业稳定。然而在2020年年底，命运的转折来得猝不及防。他在受邀期间突发脑梗中风，导致右侧肢体萎缩，舌根受损，失去言语能力，也无法继续工作。当时，他的老板娘姐妹为他筹款进行手术，使他的病情暂时稳定下来。

2022年，他的身体状况稍有恢复后，便回到马来西亚关丹，由堂妹王丽巧姐妹照顾了10个月。然而，家庭纷争让他再次陷入困境。最终由梁建成牧师收留，住进爱心之家收留所。

财务危机与援助之手

2024年3月，王建益的房产因长期未能偿还贷款而面临封锁，而他的保险理赔也因“未来可康复并恢复工作能力”为由，被拒绝了三次。得知此事后，我主动联系贷款银行及保险公司，并与他的堂妹进行沟通，协助重新提交医生最新报告，证明他已完全丧失工作及语言沟通能力。同时，在农历新年期间，我们特别安排他的父亲（已中风12年、居住在阿罗阿卡老人院）与爱心之家收留所的弟兄姐妹共度除夕夜，一家人得以团聚。

此外，王建益还有一辆汽车已闲置五年未曾启动。为了帮助他减轻债务负担，2024年2月，我安排一位同学向他购买车辆，以所得款项偿还六个月的贷款。在4月，我为他向**马来西亚信贷咨询与债务管理机构（PKPKM）**申请了两年降低还款的计划。感谢主的带领，在5月份，PKPKM 批准了他的申请；而到了9月份，保险公司也终于同意赔偿。这份恩典不仅解决了他的财务危机，也让他的房产问题在长达两年的困境后得到解决。

信仰的转变与生命的更新

在这期间，王建益深受梁牧师和叶牧师的关怀，不仅在收留所中得到了居住的保障，也在每日的查经和陪伴中逐渐认识到基督的爱。最终，在2024年圣诞节前，他因着上帝的恩典，接受耶稣基督为个人救主，受洗归入主的名下。这一刻，不仅是生命的转折，更是信仰的觉醒，见证了上帝如何在困境中施行奇妙的救赎。

新的开始

2025年2月，他的前老板娘姐妹特地从新加坡前来探访，并协助他前往新加坡处理相关文件，结束旧房屋租约。愿上帝为他做好预备，希望这间房子在6月份成功重新出租，所得租金足以支付他在老人院的生活费用，使他能年近迈父亲身边尽最后的孝心。

回望这一切，我们深知是神奇妙的安排，使王建益弟兄在困境中经历上帝的恩典与眷顾。这不仅是一场生命的翻转，更是信仰的见证，彰显了基督的爱如何在人最无助时伸出拯救之手。愿这个故事成为我们的激励，使我们在困境中仍持守信心，见证上帝的慈爱与信实。

Day 5: **“Light In Darkness”** – Sister Sharmilah Ambualagan, encouraged participants to be beacons of hope and positivity in challenging times.

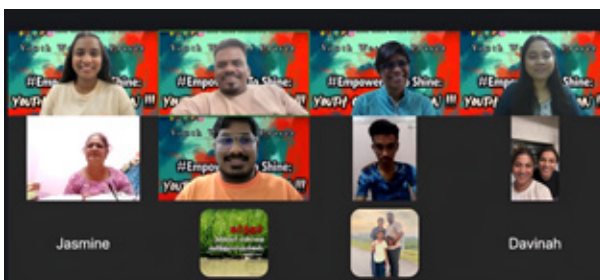

Day 7: **“Commissioned To Go”** – Sister Shirley Robert, empowered participants to actively share the gospel and make a meaningful impact in their communities.

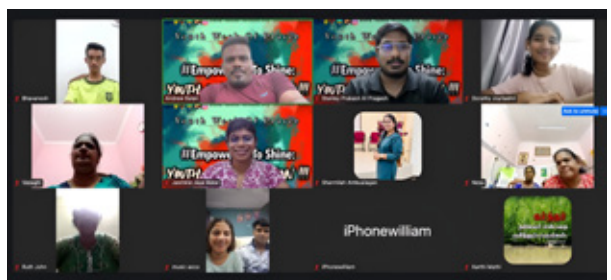

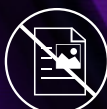

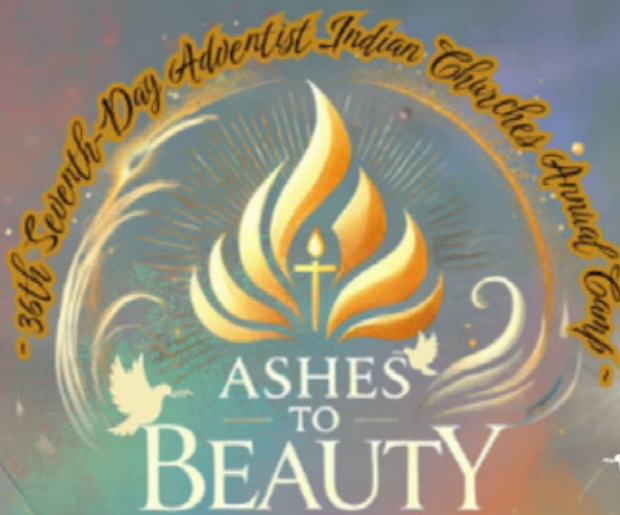
